## **Happy Candlemas!**

As I write this the Candlemas Bells are beginning to bloom in my garden. Snowdrops also known as Candlemas bells because they bloom around the time of Candlemas – 2<sup>nd</sup> February.



But what is Candlemas?

On February 2<sup>nd</sup>, exactly 40 days after Christmas, we commemorate the occasion when Mary, following Jewish law, brought the baby Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem. The Gospel reading for The Feast of the Presentation describes the scene: "And when the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord." The story continues as Simeon holds the baby in his arms and says that Jesus will be a light for the Gentiles (Luke 2:22-32).

In Christian communities around the world today, Candlemas continues to be a day of purification, renewal, and hope. It can be celebrated as a procession of light with the focus being on Simeon's words that Jesus would be a light. Some churches hold their Christingle service at Candlemas to celebrate Jesus as light of the world.

In days gone by Candlemas was a great celebration and candles were bought into church to be blessed. If you live your life without electric light then candles have a great importance in bringing light to dark evenings and dull days. For those Christians it was easy to imagine Christ as a light: a light to guide them through dark and dismal days.

In popular culture many traditions and sayings arose around the celebration of Candlemas. I am a Lacemaker and some of my ancestors were Bedfordshire lacemakers living in 'Lace Villages'. Lacemakers celebrated Candlemas with a feast and such games as jumping over the candlestand. This led to the well-known nursery rhyme: "Jack be Nimble, Jack be quick, Jack jump over the candlestick."



The picture shows a Lacemakers' Candlestand. The Candle in the centre is surrounded by glass globes. The glass globes are filled with water. When the candle is lit the glass globes magnify the light enabling several Lacemakers to share the light from one candle.

This reminded me of the words of Jesus from Matthew's gospel chapter 5: 14-16 -

"You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

People who live in darkness can understand the importance of putting their light on a stand, Lacemakers who work by candlelight understand the need to share the light and magnify it to give the best light possible. In the 21<sup>st</sup> century with all the advantages of electricity and instant light at the flick of a switch it may be good for us to remember what darkness is like. It may also be good for us to remember how good it feels when light floods into a dark space. As Christians we know we can let the Christ light flood into our hearts and we know we are able to shine out as lights in the world spreading Jesus' message of light wherever we go.

Candlemas stands between Christmas and Easter, between birth and death and on to resurrection.

We stand near the place of new birth. Let us shine with the light of your love.

We turn from the crib to the cross. Let us shine with the light of your love.

We go to carry his light. Let us shine with the light of his love.

# MARBURY MERRY DAYS MEETING – MONDAY 7<sup>1H</sup> FEBRUARY, 7.30 PM,

It was good to see new faces at the last meeting, and it we hope to see as many people as possible at the next meeting – offers of help and new ideas are always very welcome.

#### **OUR NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN**

We have reached the stage of producing a draft Neighbourhood Plan. The draft plan has been sent to Cheshire East Neighbourhood Planning Team for their feedback and to review our next steps.

Our Neighbourhood Plan allows us to have a voice in the future planning of our community. The plan includes a description of our Parish, Vision and Objectives and detailed planning policies covering the protection of the countryside, heritage, housing, the local economy, building design, tourism, recreation and local telecommunications infrastructure.

Our Neighbourhood Plan has to be in conformity with national planning policy and the Cheshire East Local Plan. Having an adopted plan means that **planners must take into account** our vision of what the future looks like and what is appropriate for our combined Parish.

Our plan is about 'land use', what the land is used for, what is supported (and what is not) and how any development fits in to our environment and how it impacts the community and other matters requiring or affecting planning consent. Our plan does not cover issues or problems relating to the state of the roads, speed limits, litter, or public transport.

Now we are at the stage of where we need your views on the draft plan prior to a Spring Time event in Marbury Village Hall where the Neighbourhood Plan can be viewed again, explained, discussed, and further refined.

The new play area is now open—and is proving very popular! The Parish Council has funded the equipment and soon there will be additional facilities for adult use.




Parish Councillor John David has been the driving force behind the renovation; many thanks John for all your work and involvement!
