Often, when I am out and about in the world, I come across people who are interested in who I am and what I do. This gives me the opportunity to drop into the conversation that I am a woman of faith, which can provoke an interesting response. Over the years, I have learned to explain my faith in, what to me is its simplest, yet most powerful, form. It's all about love. God loves me and I love him back and with that love I try and do my best for him and those around me. Sometimes I succeed, often I fail, but God is very forgiving and I am very stubborn, so I keep trying.

Jesus was once asked a question by the Pharisees; it went something like this: 'Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?' Jesus replied, 'You should love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.'

There is a beautiful passage in 1 Corinthians 13, often read at marriage ceremonies, where we hear these beautiful words about the gift of love, 'love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. (verse 4). The chapter ends with the words 'And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.' (verse 13). Love is a beautiful thing and Jesus' words tell us how important love is. We love our God; we love our neighbour and we love ourselves. Simple, but notice that we are third on the list! There are many types of love, the love we have for our parents, siblings and partners, love for our friends, love for our children and grandchildren, love of our hobbies and sports, love for animals, love for places, sacrificial love, all sorts of different kinds of love.

The love we receive from God is unconditional and abundant, it comes with no conditions attached and nothing can separate us from it. It is available to us all. The Bible portrays God's love as like the love of a good mother, as persistent as the love of a faithful father, as passionate as the love of a bridegroom for his bride. God's love is patient and kind, long suffering and forgiving and God never stops loving us no matter what. From this love, everything else will flow.

We can make our faith very complicated and we can get distracted by all sorts of things. Circumstances can overtake and overwhelm us and this simple message can be easily lost. It is important to keep bringing ourselves back to the core of what our faith is all about. It is all about love...

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting will immediately follow – and although again everyone is welcome to attend, only those who are on the Electoral Roll of St. Michael's may vote on matters discussed. At this meeting the Accounts for the year to 31st December 2021 will be presented and recommended for adoption. We currently have 8 members on the PCC (excluding the Vicar, our Lay Minister, the Churchwardens, our Deanery Synod representative, and Pastoral Workers, who are all ex officio), and this year three members will retire by rotation, having served three years. We also have a vacancy for another member for one year (to April 2023).
