JUBILEE TIME

I have vivid memories of running around a cold and muddy field in 1977, the year of the Queen's Silver Jubilee. I think it was June but it felt more like December and our Parish had organised some 'games' to celebrate the occasion. All the young people received a mug from the Vicar who was standing inside a cattle trailer sheltering from the wind.

Another 45 years on and the Queen remains a part of the heritage and culture of our country and our Church. Our Queen has experienced many ups and downs since those 1977 days, and yet has managed to pull through these times of difficulty with dignity and grace. She often mentions the sense of duty she feels as Monarch and makes no secret of the fact that she has a strong Christian faith. She herself says this about her faith, 'For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life'.

In her Christmas Message in 2014 she spoke these words: "For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace,..... is an inspiration and an anchor in my life. A role model of reconciliation and forgiveness, he stretched out his hands in love, acceptance and healing. Christ's example has taught me to seek to respect and value all people of whatever faith or page." all people of whatever faith or none."

Our Platinum Jubilee celebrations are once again happening in June, I am hoping the weather will be better than in 1977 for all those planned activities up and down the country, including our own here in Marbury. As our Queen is the 'Defender of the Faith and Supreme Governor of the Church of England (official title), the Church has produced some special prayers for celebrating the Queen's Jubilee this year. I have chosen one that, perhaps, we could all join in saying at sometime this month for our longest reigning Monarch, Elizabeth.

O Lord, the Way, the Truth, and the Life, we give you thanks for your servant, Elizabeth our Queen.
May she ever be provided with all she may need for her ministry among us,

strengthened to meet every demand which her office may make, and in all things nourished by your word and example, who with the Father and the Holy Spirit live and reign, world without end. Amen

UKRAINE REFUGEES As we watch the crisis in Ukraine continue our thoughts are very much in the form of "how can we help?" That was the question I posed to Marbury residents and as I expected the

response was positive: we must be able to do something, but what? We have now formed a small group with a purpose, at the moment, of raising funds to help any Ukrainian family who may be housed in Marbury or the surrounding area. Hosting a family is a real game changer with challenges including language barriers, a commitment to host for a minimum of 6 months, finding schooling for children (most of the refugees are mothers and children), transportation, employment for any adult, benefits, registering with doctors, dentists etc., to name but a few and, of course, the family will be trying to deal with the trauma they have experienced. Clearly both the host and the family will need a tremendous amount of support. There is potential for a host in Marbury but, for the time being, we are aware of hosts in and around Wrenbury and Malpas only.

Our intention is to raise funds in order to support any future settlement of a family in Marbury and, if not, to support any other family in the local area. We started our fund raising with a coffee morning on Friday 20th May and with your marvellous generosity we raised a staggering £627—and donations are still being received. I can't thank you all enough and I can assure you every penny will be wisely spent. There will be other fund raising events but in the meantime I will keep you up to date with funds in and funds out! A huge thank you to you all for your support.

PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual Parish Meeting was held on Tuesday, 17th May, in the Village Hall, at 7.00 p.m. Residents from Bradeley Green presented the meeting with their views on the recent planning application for a golf driving range in the area. This meeting was followed by the AGM of the Parish Council.

Joe Briggs was elected Chair of the Council, Fiona Wilson Vice Chair.

Financial matters and Planning Applications were reviewed.

A summary of the representation made to the Cheshire East Licensing Authority in respect of Combernere Abbey was given.

Councillor John David gave information regarding discussions with Highways. He urges all residents to report problems such as potholes via the App—Fix My Street. This will notify the relevant Authority and oblige them to carry out repairs promptly.

The next meeting will be on Monday, 11th July, at 7.30 p.m. All are welcome to attend; if you wish to speak at the meeting please contact the Chair or the Clerk beforehand.

Having received numerous concerns regarding the Licence Application for the Combermere Abbey events venue, the Parish Council represented residents at a meeting of the Cheshire East Licensing Authority on Tuesday, 17th May. Representatives for the Applicants, a Wedding Event organising company, sought to reassure the Committee that all efforts would be put into the minimisation of noise and disturbance. Fireworks will not be allowed at functions after those already booked later this year and one in July 2023.

The Parish Council voiced the concerns of residents about the possibility of events occurring on a 365 days a year basis, with the potential risk of damage to their privacy and sleep, and harm to livestock and wildlife.

They also pointed out that notices of the application were only placed on the busy A525 road (and local newspaper) where it was impossible for anyone passing by to stop and read the notices. The Licensing Authority is being urged to increase the release of this information beyond the minimum legal requirement by notifying neighbouring Parish Councils of applications in the future.

MARBURY MERRY DAYS

- 2 Locate the problem on a map of the area

- 4 Fix My Street will send it to the council on your behalf

GO-TOO: An on demand, flexible minibus service for rural areas south-west of Nantwich.

Tickets for the bus service will be £3 for people aged 16 and over and £2 for under-16s and concessions.

For every five journeys taken, users will get the sixth journey free.

Information on how to book the service and which areas are included etc., can be found on the council's website at http://www.go-too.co.uk

Alternatively, ring 0300 123 5103, between 9am and 5pm, Monday to Friday or download the app.

Travel is between 7.00 a.m. and 9.00 p.m., Monday to Saturday.

FLEXILINK is a transport service providing an alternative means of travel for Cheshire East residents if you have a disability, are aged 80 or over, or live beyond the reach of any other public transport.



The fare is £3 per journey or free if you have a concessionary bus pass.

All journeys must be pre-booked by calling between 24 hours ahead and one month in advance of when you wish to travel.

The core hours of the service are between 9.30am and 2.30pm Monday to Friday.

There is a limited service for group bookings between 8.30 and 9.30am and 2.30 and 4.30pm.
