### **September Parish Letter**

'Worry does not empty tomorrow of its sorrow, it empties today of its strength'.

This is a quote by American author Leo Buscaglia, and it makes what we often forget abundantly clear: no matter how much you worry about something, you cannot change the outcome, worry serves no purpose!

So how come most of us spend so much of our time worrying? I believe it has something to do with us forgetting how to live in the present moment.

During Covid 19, when we were in lockdown, many of us had to stop and re-learn how to live a slower, simpler, way of life - living moment by moment as we waited to hear the news bulletins for each day, discovering how that news would impact us individually, as a nation, and a world.

Sometime on, our concern for living our lives has changed but, only in the respect that we face a different kind of uncertainty as the cost-of-living rises, the war in the Ukraine continues, we're hearing of strikes and disputes, and global warming seems a threat greater than we and the world ever anticipated.

The Bible has a lot to say about worry, why, because God knows how vulnerable we are. God's advice is remarkably similar to Buscaglia's, and I guess that as God was here before Buscaglia he may have formed his thinking from such wisdom.

'Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough worry of it's own'.

The author Henry Nouwen once interviewed a pair of trapeze artists. They explained the very special relationship that exists between the flyer and the catcher. One has to be prepared to let go and the other has to be prepared to bring their partner to safety.

But the one thing the flyer must never do is try to catch the catcher!

That way, apparently, leads to disaster. Only one of them does the catching and, until that happens, the other must concentrate on one thing - flying!

At times, when we are stressed out or worried, we might be tempted to hurry God along, or try to do His Work for Him. But we need to trust that He won't let us fall.

He's the catcher.

That's His job...

And until then, it's our job to keep flying.

So, how do we keep our heads up, how do we fly? Well, I like one of the other bible verses that says:

'Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus'.

Brush up your wings everyone...


