Sea Glass – a Summer Reflection

Recently I had the pleasure of looking for sea glass on a stony beach. You need a keen eye to spot it but, when a tiny reflection or a hint of colour catches the sunshine, you focus and if you're lucky you find a little bit of this treasure. I love the fact that something someone has thrown away can become a thing of beauty over time.

This made me think about God. This is just like Him; to turn something that we believe has no use into something beautiful, He is after all a creator: The Creator!

This is how I see Him working in the lives of human beings, including my own.

Bottles and other items made of glass that end up in the sea are usually some sort of container. Once its contents are exhausted, it is cast aside. The redundant container then skips along the surface of drains, streams, rivers, often ending up in the ocean, where it weathers through storms smashing into pieces on its journey.

The tide then brings the pieces to the surface and washes over them, repeatedly; time and time again, and this action of being swept back and forth, rounds the edges of each piece, blunting the broken sides until a smooth frosted jewel is finally brought up on the shore.

There are many passages in The Bible that speak about God's People being refined like silver or shaped like potter's clay; working the lumps and bumps out of us, the impurities and imperfections.

Like empty containers that get buffeted around in the storms of the sea, our life experiences can do the same, resulting in feelings of use-lessness, frustration and brokenness. Little wonder we end up with sharp edges that cut and damage others.

The Bible teaches that persistence reaps reward and that there is no cheap or easy way to God's salvation. Steadfast faith in our journeys and strength in the hope of God's Word brings beauty from ashes.

God's eternal plan is to create righteous people who will reflect His splendour and glory in the world. We may feel a long way from His plan, but He is the Sovereign Ruler of the world, and we can be sure He will carry out His purpose, His mission.

I've collected many pieces of sea glass over the years, and I love to hold them in my hand often admiring how different each one is. Yet, each one has some thing in common. They began life as something very different, useful then cast aside and forgotten, and then, restored to something completely new...

I believe God can and will do the same with each of us...



This is a one-off, incredible opportunity to hear about crime fiction and the real criminal world.

Simon Michael's career as a crime author began in the 1980s with books published in the UK and in the USA. After a long gap while he pursued his career at the Bar, he resumed full-time writing in 2015. Since then he has established a reputation as "the British John Grisham" for his 9-book legal thriller series. Published by Sapere Books they feature his antihero barrister, Charles Holborne, an East End villain made good, battling the prejudices of the 1960s, the Kray twins and the corrupt Metropolitan Police. Simon believes himself to be the only member of the Honourable Society of the Middle Temple formerly to have been a council labourer, a van driver and a gardener. He practised as a barrister for 37 years, working at the Old Bailey and other criminal courts, defending and prosecuting a wide selection of murderers, armed robbers, con artists and other assorted villainy, gathering enough real-life stores to populate an entire series of crime fiction.

PALS, is the Patient Advice and Liaison Service. It is an English NHS Hospital Service which provides and offers confidential advice, support and information on health-related matters. It is a point of contact for patients, their relatives and carers.

They also are there for any concerns or complaint about the service being received in hospital, or to pass on a compliment about service received.

Usually the PALS team have an appointment system and appointments can be booked by ringing your local hospital.

If you hold a **Blue Badge** you may be exempt from some road toll charges. Visit the website below where you can read where the exemptions are including details in regards to the London Congestion Charge.

'Which' - the consumer organization - has a Scam Alerts free service which you can trust. It is designed to help people stay informed about the latest scams and avoid falling victim to fraud. Visit - www.which.co.uk and sign up for the scam alert emails. The website also has other information such as how to spot potential scams, different types, etc.

Continence products for personal use can be VAT-exempt in the UK for individuals who are disabled or have a long-term illness. This means that eligible individuals can purchase these products without paying the standard 20% VAT. However, it is not easy to see where this is mentioned on some online websites where many people now purchase them. It is also worth asking other retailers, such as chemists and supermarkets, if they are marked as VAT free and, if not, can you have the reduction as they are for personal use.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION:

The Parish Council has received a Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) payment of £6,324, to help with infrastructure in the area.

They would like residents' views on how to use this funding. The money must be spent on Infrastructure Projects/Projects to support the demands of local development.

Some ideas might include: Play Area Upgrades, Traffic Signage or Calming Measures, Village Hall Improvements, Walking or Cycling Infrastructure.
