Being Human...

I write my first newsletter of 2026 following reports of this year's first disturbing killing. ICE, the USA's Immigration and Customs Enforcement agency shot dead a woman behind the wheel of her own vehicle stating that she was endangering public safety.

Our reaction to this sort of news brings two options our way: first we can tut, be grateful that our own police don't carry weapons that can take a life, and then simply move on and away from such news — or we can choose to say enough is enough!

Following Jesus calls his disciples to radical change. The Bible says clearly that when some of the early followers realised that there was 'a cost' to following the Messiah many turned away! Their attitude was to tut; turn a blind eye and continue to live the comfortable or uncomfortable lives they were living.

But for others, their eyes were opened — opened to a leader whose ways and words were different from just human perspectives! Both fascinated and inspired they grew in their trust and understanding of this Rabbi, Jesus, whose presence was like nothing they had experienced before.

Excited, confused, fearful but overwhelmingly ready by the circumstances they were living in, these disciples, both men and women, followed him. And over the generations the same followers of Jesus have brought radical change to the world.

Very often, people tell me that 'Religion is the cause of the world's warring and suffering.' I agree!

Religion is a broad system of beliefs, practices, morals, ethics, and worldviews.

Followers of Jesus are not religious — they follow a person, not a broad system of worldly beliefs!

The path of Jesus's followers is far narrower, which is why many fall away...

The present circumstances of our world are drawing people back to faith, not religion. We are living in and through horrific troubling times, as many generations before us have experienced. So, what is the answer? Wrong question — *Who* is the answer?

As a Priest who serves the Christian Church and tries to follow the ways and practices of Jesus, I am no longer prepared to simply sit and continue living my comfortable life. I am ready to make a stand for justice, mercy, and peace. The question is, Are You?

I invite you to make a radical change to your life and the ways of our world this year.

As a church we can offer a place for you to explore the ways of Jesus through Alpha, or other events we'll be providing this year, or you can begin a different kind of journey by opening for yourself the ancient scriptures that have remained constant throughout every generation — the Holy Bible.

The choice is yours. Will you sit, turn a blind eye, and remain where you are being influenced by the world — or will you be adventurous, believing that there might just be a God after all?!

Following 10 years of Parish Ministry here with you all, I would like to introduce a few changes to the structure of our services here at St Michael's and across the four churches.

These changes come after very careful consideration regarding those of us who lead services, those who attend worship regularly and those who are perhaps new to church.

The new pattern at St Michael's will be a service of Evening Prayer on the first Sunday, at either 4pm or 6pm depending on the time of year. The second Sunday sees us offer a new service at 11am, designed to give a little flexibility in our worship and looking, this particular year, at Why We Worship! The third Sunday will be a 9am service of Holy Communion, as will be the fourth Sunday at 11am. Fifth Sundays will continue to follow the existing pattern of a United Service in one of our four churches, by rotation. (Times may change occasionally for Special Services – for example Mothering Sunday.)

It will take us all a little time to adjust to the new structure but I whole heartedly believe that, when we do, it will help us all, in the busyness of life, to make time for Worship, Thanksgiving and Rest in God on our Sabbath Sundays.

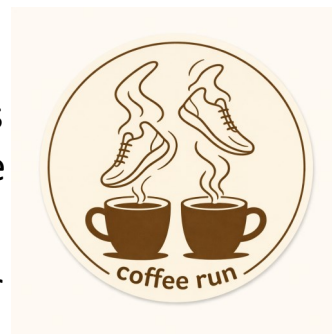
For every £100 raised, I will run another 5K, with donations helping to provide coffee gift cards for people undergoing cancer treatment through charities and hospices.

The Little Book of Big Scams booklet was originally produced by the Metropolitan Police and is not available from all police forces; however, many police forces and local councils across the UK have either reproduced it or created their own versions. You can typically download the booklet from the website of the police force in your area or from organizations like the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau. Some police forces may also have it in hard copy form.

If a hospital or service cancels your operation at the last minute and for non-clinical reasons, (e.g. lack of staff, beds, admin error, etc.) they should offer another binding date within 28 days or fund your treatment at a date and hospital of your choice. If you're not offered an appointment within 28 days, you should complain to your local ICB. (Integrated Care Board).

If your operation is cancelled before the day of admission, the hospital or service is not obliged to provide an alternative option within 28 days.

However, your right to start consultant-led treatment within a maximum waiting time still stands. If cancelling your appointment results in you having to wait longer, you have the right to ask the hospital or ICB to move you to a different provider.

My local council is reducing bin collections from fortnightly to every three weeks. I may struggle to move my bin to the gate with the extra week's waste. Is it possible to arrange for the bin to be collected directly from where it's kept? How can I arrange this? - You'll need to contact your local council and request an Assisted Bin Collection service. Most councils offer this support for residents who genuinely need it, though there is an eligibility criteria to meet. It's worth visiting your council's website first to check the specific requirements and application process for your area, as these can vary between councils.

If you are finding it increasingly difficult to read newspapers, even with regularly updated glasses, you could try a Talking Newspaper service: The Talking News Federation maintains a comprehensive directory of Talking Newspaper services across the whole of the UK, including Northern Ireland. You can find details of your local service by visiting their website at tnf.org.uk. This is an excellent free resource that makes staying informed much more accessible.

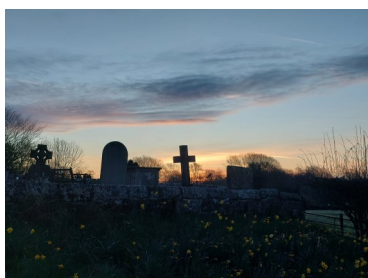
